Activity 6.5

1. Income is money earned by a business for services rendered, goods sold, rent or interest received.

An expense is a payment for goods and services that the business uses to generate its income. This could include cost of sales, consumable stores, stationery, rates, fuel, repairs and maintenance, salaries and wages paid to employees. (4)

2. The accounting name for the following transactions:

a. Money received from services (Income): Services rendered or Current income.

b. Bought envelopes (Expense): Stationery

c. Paid for an advert in the paper (Expenses): Advertising

d. Received interest from the bank (Income): Interest received (4)

3. Her total income is R28 590.

Her total expenses are R17 550

Profit = Income minus expenses, so: R28 590 – R17 550 = R11 040.

This means Streaks-Ahead made a profit in October. (4)

4. a. Learners' answers will differ but they need to provide adequate reasons for their answers. (2)

b. Profit from shampoo sales is R1 500 (R3 500 – R2 000). (2)



How to draw a portrait

(A&C SO1: AC1-3, SO7: AC1, 3)

You will need: a piece of paper, something to draw with and a partner.

- 1 Sit opposite your partner. Make sure you are both comfortable. Study your partner's face carefully. Lightly draw the main shapes of your partner's face. Draw his or her head, shoulders and hair outline. Keep looking at your partner's face and then look at your drawing of his or her face. Don't rub out any lines. If you want to change something, just draw a new line over the other line.



- 2 Look carefully at your partner's eyes. How big are they? How close together are they? Have you remembered to draw in the eyebrows and eyelashes? Look at your partner's nose. Practise drawing its shape in the air. Draw the tip of the nose and the nostrils first as they are usually the easiest part to draw. Now look at the mouth. Can you see that the darkest part of the mouth is the line between the two lips? Draw this line first and then the rest of the mouth.



- 3 Now look at your partner's face for areas of light and shade. Are there any shadows around your partner's eyes or nose? Shade them in. Draw your partner's hair. Use lines that follow the way the hair grows.



- 4 Now add in any other things. Is your partner wearing earrings? Does he or she wear glasses? Does he or she have freckles?
